1. What is meant by the phrase: “time of the end” in verses 17 & 19?
2. Who is the “stern-faced king” of verse 22?
3. How long is the time designated for the vision to be fulfilled? What hope can Daniel (and the Jews) draw from this number?
4. What are the nine significant traits that Antiochus Epiphanes and the Antichrist share?
5. Why do you think these parallels exist? What can we learn from them?
6. What does Daniel do after having received these revelations? (Verse 27) How might this action be similar to Jesus in Luke 2:49?
7. What hope do we have for the last days?
8. Zac has spoken often about “Our great hope.” What is it?

▶ Level Two “When” questions ◀

9. Read 2 Corinthians 5:10 & Romans 14:12.
10. (Share about) When have ever considered that you will, certainly, one day, stand before Jesus and give Him an account of your life?
11. Does this future (yet certain) event fill you with joy or fear? Why?
12. When have you ever gotten a “do-over”, in this life?
13. Where do you need a “wake up call” to realize your mistakes and get busy doing your Father’s business?

▶ Level Three “How” questions ◀

14. How does an awareness of the fact that you will stand before Jesus and give Him a personal accounting of your life persuade you to consider how you live?
15. How can we more and more deny ourselves and be about our Father’s business?
16. How can we learn and discover what business our Father has for us to do?
17. Since we will not be able to get a “do-over” once we are standing before our Lord, how can you give yourself a “mid-term” now to see if you pass the test? (See 2 Corinthians 13:5)
18. How are the parables of Matthew 25 a relevant warning to us?
19. How will you change how you are living now because of this sermon?
20. (Everybody) How will you specifically put what this sermon has taught you into practice?
