1. Why do you think people get defensive when the pastor talks about money?
2. Why is our attitude about money vitally important?
3. If you are stingy or miserly when giving money to God, what does this say about where your heart is in regards to God?
4. What are the three lies that sound like the truth? Why do they “sound” like the truth?
5. What are the three truths that sound like lies? Why do these “sound” like a lie?
6. Why is it easier to obey God in other areas of life, but much more difficult to obey Him when it comes to the giving of money?

7. (Share about) When have you ever been really thankful to the Lord for His blessings on your life? (Monetary or other)
8. (Share about) Where, in your life, do you need to realize that God is in control of how much money you make?
9. (Share about) When has your attitude ever changed in regards to giving to God?

10. How can we “shake off” the three lies that “seem” so much like common knowledge?
11. How can we come to an understanding and agree with the three truths that “seem” like lies?
12. How should our giving demonstrate and validate our appreciation to God because of His grace and mercy to us?
13. How can you, in practice, live out Mathew 6:33? How might living like this change your attitude toward money?
14. How will you change your attitude about money and giving because of this sermon?
15. (Challenge) How could you pray and ask God to help you to do this? (Something like: “Lord Jesus, I know I haven’t had a right attitude toward the money you bless me with. Please help me to live out my faith in my giving. Thank You.”)
