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▶ Level One “What” questions ◀

- What is the opposite of rudeness? What is the root cause of rudeness?

- What does it mean to be easily angered? Is such a person easy to live with?
- What are the three things Zac mentioned that love guards against?
- What does love do to a Christian so they are guarded from these things?
- What does it mean to keep a record of wrongs? Why would someone do this?
- What is the standard of forgiveness our Lord taught in Matt 18:21-35?
- What warning does our Lord give us all in verse 35?
- Why is forgiveness so important to God?
- What does it mean to you to put into practice this most excellent way?

▶ Level Two “When” questions ◀

- When have you ever been rude? Self seeking? Easily angered? Kept a record of wrongs done to you? When have you ever attempted to rectify your sin? What happened as a result of rectifying or not rectifying your sin?

▶ Level Three “How” questions ◀

- How can you put off rudeness/self seeking/being easily angered/keeping a record of wrongs and put on their opposite attributes?
- How much do you need God to enable you to live this way? How well can you live out this “most excellent way” by yourself?
- How much do you have to change to start living seriously in this most excellent way?
- How can you avoid going back to “your old self” with “your old ways” after we move on to another subject to study?
- How can we truly understand this “most excellent way”?
- How can you know for certain that God has “poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit”?
- How can you take one step to living in the “most excellent way”?
- How are you going to start? To whom will you choose to be accountable?
